Dear POVA Members and Friends,

Following our successful August reunion in Fayetteville, our new Board got busy on setting goals for the next two years. We're still working on this, but there are some things to report, and we'll cover those in this issue.

In the interest of "giving credit where it is due," POVA's successful August reunion would not have been so successful without the incredible efforts and commitment of VP Rich Hosier. Rich was tireless in putting together the agendas, rosters, plans, and activities that kept all in attendance focused on our time together. 

POVA's New Constitution Already Amended

During our Biennial Reunion Business Meeting, our members amended our Constitution in several ways to reflect the changes POVA was facing and to make our ongoing operations easier to manage. One of the changes was intended to more effectively open "free" membership to all Active duty and Reserve PSYOP soldiers, but the language wasn't

as well crafted as had been intended. Following discussion with other officers, the Board submitted a Constitutional amendment to the voting membership of POVA to ratify a change to clarify even more specifically that ALL Active duty and ALL Reserve PSYOP soldiers are eligible for free POVA membership as long as they are in their military assignments and organizations.

The Amendment process itself was new to POVA, as that had been a substantive change in the original Constitution. Submitted by Rick Hofmann, POVA Life Member, the proposed changes were slightly modified prior to being approved by the members at the Reunion. Using this new procedure, this "membership" amendment was passed overwhelmingly.

An updated copy of the amended Constitution is now posted on POVA's Facebook page; a copy is available to any POVA member who requests it. Upon request, a pdf of the Constitution will be emailed.

Identity of Another PSYOP Viet-Nam KIA Confirmed

During POVA's visit to the Merkel Media Operations Center (MOC) at Ft. Bragg, we passed through a well-done Hall of Honor depicting those PSYOP soldiers who lost their lives while on deployment performing PSYOP duties. In

reviewing the Hall's memorials, we found a few for whom no picture was available. In fact, POVA already had most of these pictures, and these have been shared so the Hall of Honor can be updated.

There was, however, one picture and name about which we knew absolutely nothing. LTC Ferdinand Ora Barger was a US military advisor, serving as the PSYOP Officer for the organization known as JUSPAO/MACV (Joint US-Public Affair Office/Military Assistance Command Viet-Nam). This was not a specific PSYOP organization such as 4^{th} PSYOP Group or one of the Group's battalions.

LTC Barger was KIA on 4 September 1968. As he was a trained PSYOP officer and was performing PSYOP advisory duties on behalf of the US Government, POVA's Board decided unanimously to include him with our KIA's already listed and honored on our website and during our Biennial Reunion activities. We have also learned that a classroom at the MOC was named in honor of LTC Barger. LTC Barger will be honored with his fellow KIA's at all future POVA Reunions.

Getting the Viet-Nam PSYOP Story on the Record

In a conversation about Viet-Nam, I challenged another person on his assertion that this is really only one history of the Viet-Nam War. I told him there were over 3 million American histories.....one for each of us who served, plus the countless millions of Viet-Namese people who experienced the war. It is ludicrous to posit that there is "one history" of any war, much less Viet-Nam.



In 1999 the Vietnam Center and Archive initiated the Oral History Project (OHP). The history of the wars in Southeast Asia is not complete without the inclusion of the voices of those who were in some way involved. To that end, the mission of the OHP is to create and preserve a more complete record of the wars in Southeast Asia by preserving, through recorded interviews, the recollections and experiences of all who were involved in those wars.

There is no political agenda in the development of the Archive or the Oral History Project. Anyone can participate, whether an American veteran, a former ally or enemy of the U.S., an anti-war protester, a government employee, a family member of a veteran, etc. The more breadth and depth the OHP has in its participants, the better and more authentic the collection and preservation of the history of the wars will be.

In particular, Texas Tech is looking to capture as much oral history as possible about our PSYOP experience in the war. No matter what we did, no matter our MOS, no matter when or where we were assigned "over there," we have unique recollections and experiences to share. This is an excellent opportunity for every Viet-Nam veteran, to record the history of this war from our own unique perspectives.

Your President/Interim Editor has completed a recorded interview, as have a few other of our POVA members. While you may think you have nothing to say, you really do, and someday, after having said it, somebody may learn from the words and thoughts that you would share. But, once we are gone, it is too late. Don't be "too late" with the knowledge of your time in PSYOP in Viet-Nam.

Welcome to new POVA Life Member.....Tim Fitzpatrick

POVA is pleased and proud that Tim has joined POVA as a Life Member. Tim has long been a friend of POVA, and will be a valued member for a very long time. Here is Tim's bio:

Mr. Fitzpatrick was commissioned in Infantry from DePaul University Army ROTC. He served in Psychological Operations (PSYOP), the 82d Airborne Division, the Berlin Brigade and taught Army ROTC at UNC, Wilmington. As Staff Officer, Operations, Multinational Force and Observers in the Sinai, he supervised Italian, Fijian, Columbian, UK, US and Canadians in planning ground, sea, and air operations, maintaining the Treaty of Peace between Egypt and Israel. While assigned to XVIII Airborne Corps G-3 he supervised Battle Simulations, and was Ground Liaison Officer to the 317th Tactical Airlift Wing and Pope AFB, NC, during the planning and execution of JUST CAUSE. As the Dragon Brigade S-3, he planned and coordinated XVIII Airborne Corps Rear Operations for Desert Shield/Desert Storm in Saudi Arabia and Iraq.

He instructed the Joint PSYOP Staff Planning Course, active and reserve PSYOP Officers and Advanced Individual Training courses at the US Army John F. Kennedy Special Warfare Center and School. He produced FM 33-1-1 (PSYOP Techniques and Procedures), contributed to FM 33-1 (PSYOP Doctrine) and produced PSYOP training videos and aids. He guest instructed at the United Kingdom PSYOPS course at the UK Intelligence School at Ashford Kent.

Tim is currently the civilian Deputy Psychological Operations (PSYOP) Commandant at USAJFKSWCS. Previously he developed ARSOF requirements for simulations and C2 systems, fielding the Engagement Skills Trainer, Guardfist II, elements of SOMPE to USASOC. His efforts with FBCB2, and Army Battle Command Systems, facilitated their fielding to ARSOF after 9/11. He wrote the future operating environment and PSYOP chapters for several concepts and served as a SOF SME for Wargames and Experiments. He represented USASOC to HQDA, G-3/5/7 in the Army Campaign Plan process as Chief, Transformation Division and served as Chief, Concepts Development, Chief Irregular Warfare Working Group and Chief, Army Special Operations Modeling and Simulation Office.

He is a graduate of the DOD Executive Leadership Development Program (ELDP), recognized as the Federal Government's Best Executive Leadership Development Program by Premier Defense Symposium for Human Capital Management. From 2003-2014, at the request of the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Civilian Personnel Policy, he returned as an

ELDP Team Leader, training DoD and Interagency senior civilians and selected field grade officers in a rigorous two week course at the start of a ten month Joint training program, where they experience DoD from the Warfighter's perspective in the field, across the combatant commands and services and with allied forces.

He has completed the Harvard Kennedy School Senior Executive Fellows program and has MAs in National Security and Strategic Studies from the College of Naval Warfare and International Relations from Webster University. He is a Defense Leadership and Management Program, Army Management Staff College, Army Command and General Staff College, and Army Force Management School graduate. He completed Infantry Officers Advanced, PSYOP, Mortar, Jumpmaster, Jungle, Airlift, Amphibious Operations, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Program, French Language, Civil Affairs, Regional Studies, PSYOP, Joint PSYOP Staff Planning and United Kingdom PSYOP courses. He was a designated Joint Staff Officer.

He is a Distinguished Member of the Psychological Operations (PSYOP) Regiment, and has been awarded the PSYOP Regiment MG Robert A. McClure Gold Medal, the Army Decoration for Exceptional Civilian Service, Superior Civilian Service (3), Commander's Award for Civil Service, Civilian Achievement Medal.


