- Passage of a package of amendments to the POVA Constitution which will improve our internal processes, authorize formation and operation of POVA chapters, and establish a fund-raising and philanthropic capability to assist disadvantaged veterans
- Approved a program of recognitions and special awards as follows:

As our BBQ time wound down, we were serenaded by Pipe Doug Elwell. Doug's music is always very much appreciated. Doug also piped us to dinner on Saturday evening for the Reunion Banquet, and then closed the festivities with "Amazing Grace." Truly awesome!

Saturday 13 August: We departed our hotel on a tour bus to visit the Michael A. Merkel Media Operations Center (MOC) at Ft. Bragg. We we're greeted by COL Robert A. B. Curris, Commanding Officer of the 4th Military Information Support Command (Airborne) and members of his 3d Battalion staff. COL Curris gave us an excellent tour of the MOC. The MOC is named in honor of 1LT Michael Merkel, a member of the 7<sup>th</sup> PSYOP Bn who was killed in Viet-Nam in March 1968. This is a truly remarkable facility. While at the MOC, COL Curris gave us a briefing on current activities of the 4<sup>th</sup> Group's several battalions as they are deployed in the US and around the world in support of US policy.

It is a proud Battalion, commanded by LTC Michelle Cook. Unfortunately, LTC Cook is on deployment; in her place, MAJ Tony James, Executive Officer, provided a briefing on activities of the 6<sup>th</sup> Battalion. MAJ James is an experienced PSYOP officer and great friend of POVA. Many thanks to COL Curris and MAJ James for their friendship, support, and contribution to making our visit to our PSYOP "home" a truly successful experience. You make us all proud to be part of the legacy you continue to build.

**Saturday evening**, we held our traditional Reunion Banquet at the DoubleTree Inn. A social hour preceded the "call to dinner" by Piper Doug Elwell. Of perhaps greatest significance in the pre-dinner agenda was POVA's "Rose Ceremony," in which our Association honors those PSYOP soldiers who have died while in foreign service to our nation. At our "Missing Man" table, a large vase was placed, containing 38 red roses, one for each of our honored dead. Then, as their names were read aloud by President Emeritus Mike Stoeckert, a dog tag for each man was hung on a Soldier's Cross by Chad Spawr, Rich Hosier, and Howard Patrick.

Our "Missing Man" table was marked by a folded American flag, and an original Purple Heart presentation set awarded to a combat-wounded POVA member. Each of the banquet tables was named after a PSYOP soldier who has been significant to the PSYOP profession, or who has been a significant factor in the history and growth of POVA.


